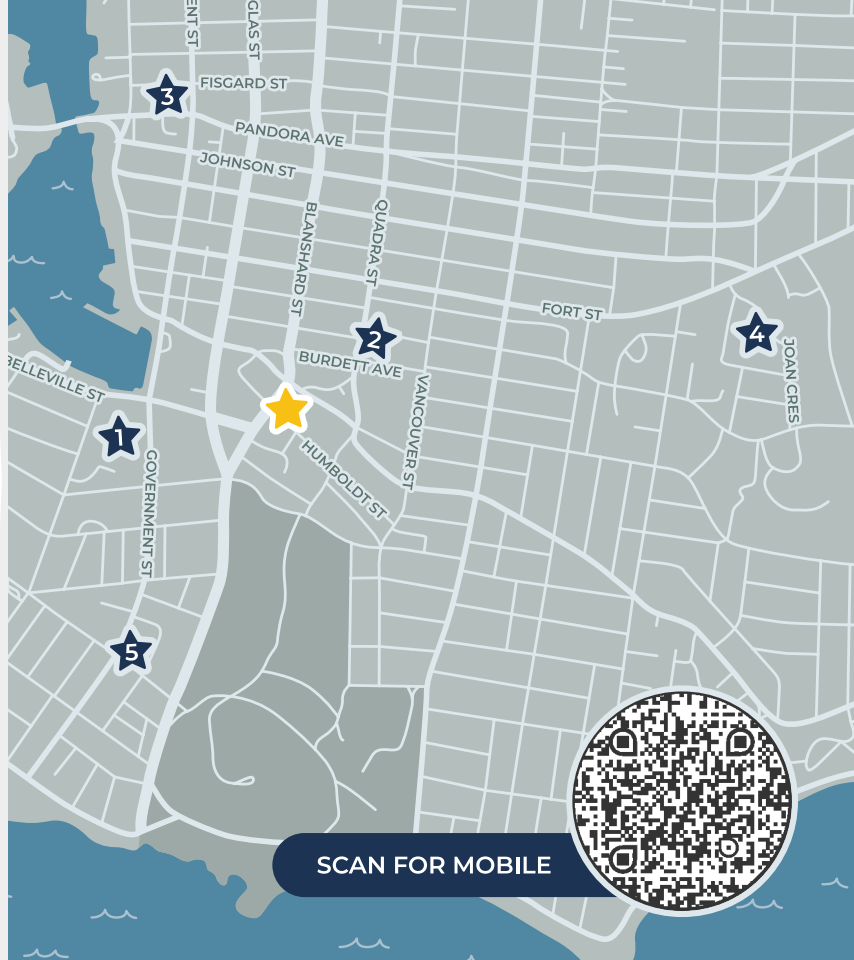

### BC LEGISLATIVE BUILDINGS

The B.C. Legislative Buildings, also called the British Columbia Parliament Buildings, are an unmistakable feature in Victoria's cityscape. The buildings have witnessed the rise of Victoria as a city and have been in their prominent spot on the water since 1897 when deemed completed in time for Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. The Parliament Buildings are open to visitors from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday.

### CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL

Victoria's historic landmark, a Gothic-style Anglican cathedral, three blocks from the Inner Harbour. Open daily for prayer and meditation from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm, enjoy the outstanding stained-glass collection, 4,000-pipe Hellmuth Wolff organ and various historic pieces.

### FAN TAN ALLEY

Located between Fisgard and Johnson St.

Fan Tan Alley is Canada's narrowest street and a side door to the oldest Chinatown in the country. Comprised of more than a dozen locally-owned shops, Fan Tan Alley offers a diverse and exciting shopping experience where you can find discover vintage records, specialty umbrellas and canes, and stylish clothing ranging from yoga wear to comfortable imports. Savour your visit and indulge in some organic treats, homemade ice cream, matcha teas and more.

### CRAIGDARROCH CASTLE

Craigdarroch Castle is a definitively Victorian experience and a National Historic Site. It is a shining example of a "bonanza castle" — massive houses built for entrepreneurs who became wealthy during the industrial age. In this case, the industrialist was Robert Dunsmuir, a Scottish immigrant who made his fortune from Vancouver Island coal.

### EMILY CARR HOUSE

Emily Carr House was the childhood home of the incredible artist, Emily Carr. This National Historic Site of Canada is a two-story picturesque-Italianate style house located on a residential lot in the James Bay district of Victoria, British Columbia.

### FORT RODD HILL

Fort Rodd Hill — A National Historic Site — is a coast artillery fort built in the late 1890s to defend Victoria and the Esquimalt Naval Base. The Fort includes three-gun batteries, underground magazines, command posts, guardhouses, barracks and searchlight emplacements. There are numerous interpretive signs and audio-visual stations, as well as period furnished rooms and friendly, knowledgeable staff.

### HATLEY CASTLE

Hatley Park National Historic Site is located in Colwood, British Columbia on the grounds of Royal Roads University. Before this Classified Federal Heritage Building was open to the public in 1995, it was used for the Royal Roads Military College as a naval training facility. You might even recognize this beautiful estate as it is a common venue for T.V. and movies!
