White is also committed to fostering a work environment focused on intercultural competency, providing an inclusive and welcoming space.

Known for her commitment to integrating environmental practices into everyday business, she champions sustainability locally and provincially and was instrumental in co-creating a green committee within the Hotel Association of Greater Victoria in 2018. She currently co-chairs the Destination Greater Victoria Sustainability Committee and is an active board member. As an associate professor at Royal Roads University, she helps shape tomorrow's leaders, teaching the theory of sustainability. White is also a business coach, helping mentees to develop their business model, overcome hurdles, provide moral support and more, for the Project Zero Incubator Program.

Prior to joining The Parkside Hotel & Spa, White worked at independently owned and operated Brentwood Bay Lodge & Spa, and with such notable Canadian brands as Sandman Hotel Group and Delta Hotels.
